

Simple signature card application procedure for company employees

A web-based registration authority (WebRA) set up by D-Trust, Bundesdruckerei's qualified trust service provider, enables companies themselves to carry out on site the legally required identification of applicants for qualified certificates. To achieve this, D-Trust provides customers with the Officer Portal.



The simplified procedure within the Officer Portal helps our clients to focus on their actual work. Long application procedures are now a thing of the past.

The combination of Officer Portal and WebRA speeds up and simplifies application procedures without compromising on security. Identification outside the company by third parties, for instance, by PostIdent, is no longer necessary. The WebRA procedure is approved by TÜViT as a procedure for external identification authorities for qualified signature and seal cards from D-Trust.

The solution and its components

The D-Trust solution is designed for companies looking to issue qualified signature and seal cards for their own employees and certainly pays off if companies need to provide a high number of employees with signature cards.

The data is captured within the customer-specific environment in the D-Trust Portal and applicants are identified by company staff trained by D-Trust, so-called Officers. The Officer Portal is a convenient user interface for Officers. All applications and valid certificate products belonging to an organisation are centrally managed here. The company's Officers confirm not only the applicant's identity but also their organisational affiliation. The application data is thus confirmed by the organisation and sent to D-Trust. A qualified signature card or seal card is issued on the basis of the application documents and then sent directly by registered mail to the respective applicants.

Requirements

- · Contract with trust service provider D-Trust
- Regular participation in Officer training and submission of certificates of good conduct by the company's Officers
- The company's Officers must be provided with Internet workstations, card readers and printers
